### METHODS OF PAYMENT

#### COMPASS



Payments can be made either in full or as a payment plan via Course Confirmation and Payments.

1. Open **Course Confirmation and Payments** and select the payments that you would like to make.
2. Either **pay in full** or a **Payment Plan** (if you choose payment plan, the total amount that you have chosen to pay will be divided by 4 and that will be the total amount deducted per instalment).
3. Complete your Debit/Credit Card details and submit.

#### CASH AND CHEQUE



Cash and cheques will be accepted at the school office. Cheques should be made payable to Great Ryrie Primary School. Payments can be made either in full or as a payment plan via Course Confirmation and Payments by printing the 'Pay In Person' page and returning this to the office with payment.

3. Select 'Pay On Person' and return completed form and payment to office.

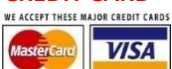
#### BPAY PAYMENT
